Training Programs: Project Archaeology: Investigating a Tabby Slave Cabin Teacher Workshop

The Northeast Region staff partnered with the National Park Service’s Kingsley Plantation and Project Archaeology to offer a two-day teacher training workshop featuring the Investigating a Tabby Slave Cabin curriculum. Seven teachers attended the workshop, which included modeling of the curriculum, discussions on how to implement the lessons and a special tour of the site.
