### Thinking Like a Network: HMS Workshops

In November, FPAN SE staff partnered with Windley Key Fossil Reef Geological State Park to host a small, socially distanced HMS workshop that would be compliant with COVID 19 policies. Accordingly, scouts completed the classroom portion of the training virtually online, before meeting up with FPAN and park staff to complete the in person portion. Monroe County is vulnerable to sea level rise, and tracking changes to these archaeological sites over time will provide valuable data about threats to site.

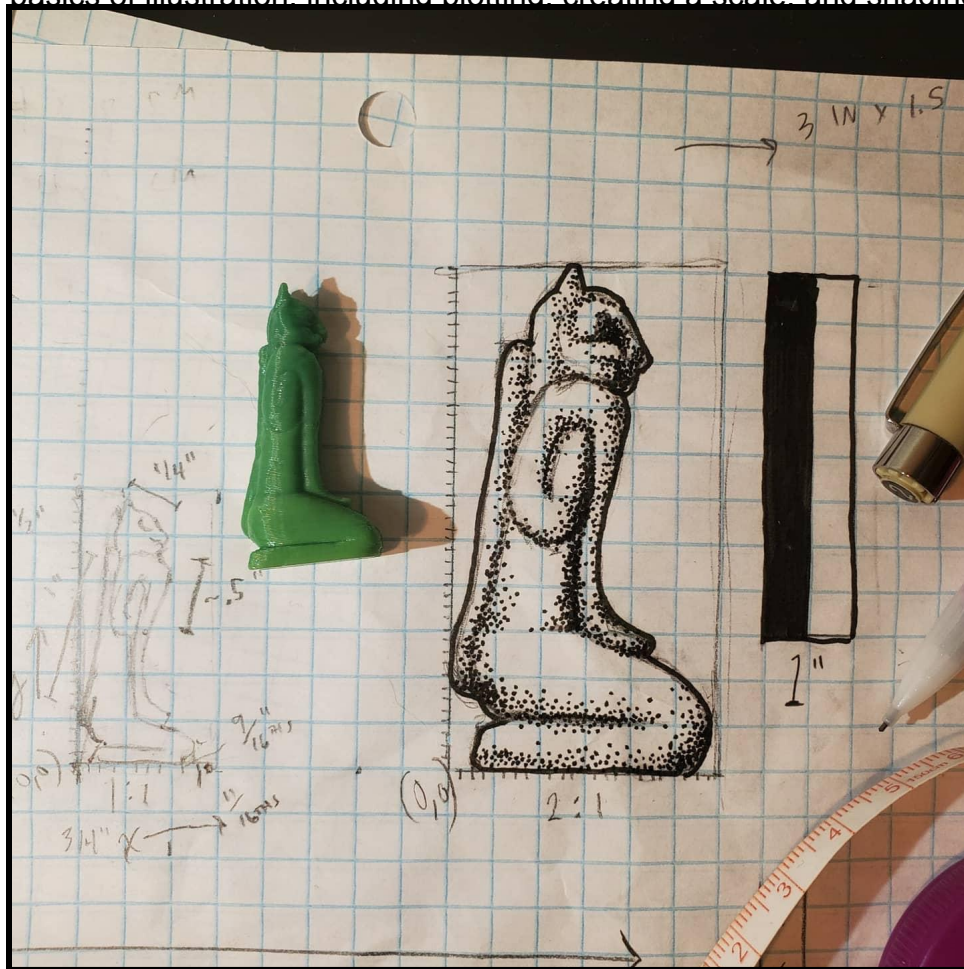
